God is so faithful! Our world is experiencing some tumultuous times, but I am reminded "there is nothing new under the sun." (Ecclesiastes 1:9) While we have been presented with a variety of challenges, our Lord has been faithful to guide us by His Spirit and calling on His saints to pray and answering those prayers. Many of you have experienced this firsthand, and others are still waiting for God's hand to move...be encouraged; our Lord has never stopped working!

July brings us many new opportunities as we now have two worship services at 9:30am and 11am. These services are identical so plan to attend the one that best fits your schedule and needs. We also will have Sunday school and Bible study opportunities at 8am, 9:30am, and 11 am on Sunday morning as well as various other times. Be sure and check with your Sunday School teacher about when your class will be meeting. You may need to sign up for a specific class time if you are in a larger class. I will be teaching an open Bible study at 6pm Sunday evenings in the sanctuary based on the scripture passage from the morning's sermon. Daniel will be teaching the college students at that time, and Randy will be teaching the Sunday School curriculum in the fellowship hall for those who desire more social distancing. On Wednesday nights at 6pm, Daniel will be working with the students, I'll be helping with children's ministry, and Randy will be leading Bible study and prayer meeting.

Speaking of children—the children's ministry is open again! Children of all ages through 6th grade need to be checked in anytime between 9:30am and noon. Everyone checks in on the main floor and nursery through kindergarten stay on the main floor (Waumbaland) and 1st-6th grades go upstairs (UpStreet). All children will have their temperature checked when they register. NOTE: any child with a fever 100.4 or above cannot check in, nor can any child that lives in the same household. For everyone's safety, if you or anyone in your family has a fever or any other symptoms, please stay home and worship with us online.

A huge thank you and blessings to all of our staff and volunteers who have worked extra hard through this pandemic to enable us to continue to minister to our church family and community. Also thank you to the church as a whole for faithful giving that has allowed us to fund all of our missions and ministries through this time.

I'm so glad to see your faces again, and I am super excited about all that the Lord is doing in and around us. Encouragement for Today

Feeling Overwhelmed?

Do you ever feel overwhelmed? How do you deal with stress? Has that changed for you over the years? I sometimes feel myself thinking about that, especially lately, during these recent times.

Some people "internalize" stress, either dealing with it on the inside, or perhaps not dealing with it at all. You might not even realize these folks have any stress in their lives. Maybe they were taught to "keep a stiff upper lip" and to work their way through whatever comes their way. Unfortunately, for some, this way of "dealing" with stress can take its toll through physical symptoms and ailments . . . Sound familiar? Then there are those who wear stress on the outside – you can't miss it! Short tempers, just a little "snippy", maybe this sounds familiar. Have you learned to navigate stress more effectively through the years, or do you still struggle with it? This is for sure: stress can affect you on several levels, including physically, emotionally, and spiritually. It can affect your home life, your work life, your relationships.

What can be done?

I have some practical advice (yours to take or leave, as you see fit).

Pray about your "yes" and "no" answers. You don't have to say yes to every request. Ask God what He would have you do, then do it. Don't feel pressure from people to do things He would not want you to do. Seek His will above all else.

Are you getting good rest? I know when I am not resting well, it affects how I deal with stress. Take a nap if you need to. Yes, you have permission!

Eat well and get exercise. I know, when I am stressed, the last thing I want to do is watch what I eat or to get exercise, but these can seriously have an effect! A good walk always helps me relieve stress.

Now, what does scripture say about stress? Don't let Satan overwhelm you! Give your cares to God. 1 Peter 5:7 reminds us to "cast all your worries on him because he cares for you." He doesn't say ignore them, just to give them to Him.

Philippians 4:6-7 says "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Need more reassurance? Try these:

Psalm 61:2-3 "From the ends of the earth, I will cry to you for help, for my heart is overwhelmed. Lead me to the towering rock of safety, for You are my safe refuge, a fortress where my enemies cannot reach me."

Matthew 6:34 "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble."

Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

Give it to Him.

Doesn't that make you feel better, safer, less stressed already?
